## SAIL "Starting" Class Offered Sunday Mornings

SAIL is a 4-part discipleship series for the adults of St. Barnabas. The series is based on the premise that "growing congregations are comprised of growing individuals." Our goal is not to simply "make members" for St. Barnabas, but to "make disciples" of Jesus Christ. Each of the four segments is a 4-hour experience to help us grow in our faith.

The first segment, *Starting*, is a refresher class for current members of St. Barnabas as well as introduction for people considering membership at St. Barnabas. The pastors give an overview of the Bible, discuss our worship practices, and lead a study of St. Barnabas' mission statement.

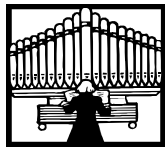


### Lunchtime Organ Recital Series
