Nine students and two adults from St. Barnabas will be traveling to Logan, West Virginia June 18-27 on a mission trip coordinated through YouthWorks! These "missionaries" will be commissioned at the 10:00 worship service on Sunday, June 6.

YouthWorks! is a multi-denominational ministry based here in Minneapolis dedicated to providing resources that enable churches to do life-changing student ministry and mission work. Quite simply, YouthWorks! purpose is to provide life-changing, Christ-centered youth mission opportunities. They create extraordinarily fun and significant mission adventures, targeted to the needs and capabilities of students.

YouthWorks! has an exciting week of ministry prepared for the St. Barnabas missionaries in the Logan area. They will serve in two ways — through Kids Club and work projects. Kids Club is a hands-on afternoon program offering high-energy games, crafts, skits, songs and interactive lessons to help community kids learn about Jesus. Work projects will generally include painting and some minor home repairs.

Each day ends with "Evening Club". Club is a gathering for upbeat guitar playing and singing, perhaps some skits and games, a time to share "Yea, God!" talks (a Christ-centered talk given by one of the YouthWorks! staff), and time to

pray together. It is an energetic time designed specifically for youth.

On the trip out the group will be staying overnight at Living Lord Lutheran, Bartlett, IL and Prince of Peace Lutheran, Loveland, OH. On the way back, they will stay in motels in Ashland, KY and Schaumburg, IL.

There is some fun built in to the trip as well — a Chicago Cubs game at Wrigley Field on the way out and whitewater rafting down the New River on the way back.

The youth want to thank everyone from the congregation who is supporting them through prayer and their fundraisers. They will share their experiences with the congregation later this summer.

## St. Barnabas Hosts Grief Coalition During Summer

Weekly meetings of the West Suburban Grief Coalition will be held at St. Barnabas each Thursday from June 3—August 26.

## New Photo Exhibit by John Hardy

A collection of stunningly beautiful photography by local photographer John Hardy is currently on display in the Gardenview Gallery at St. Barnabas. The exhibit features photos of flowers, animals, jasper and agate taken, in some cases, *very* close up.

John writes of his work:

*I like trying to get shots of things in an “artistic” way. God has made beautiful and complex things in his creation and allowed man to do the same with his hands. I try to find the hidden beauty, complex patterns and unique perspectives that will cause you to pause and think about life in a better way. In 2001, I started out taking pictures of polished agates using complex lighting and lens techniques. This proved both time consuming and costly due to the uncertain results. With the advent of digital, the cost of*

*wasted film and associated lost time has been eliminated. Now, when taking digital images of difficult subjects, there is nothing like seeing the results instantly and getting to try again immediately.*

*The beginnings of Mighty Macro (Mighty stands for “The Almighty”) date back to the year 2000. I happened to look at a polished agate under a microscope and suddenly had the realization that this truly was art frozen in time. “Could it be possible to capture the look of swirls and depth of color visible through the microscope lens?” I wondered. Since I have always been an avid rock collector, finding good subjects was not a problem. Eventually, with the help of an old optical bench and special lenses (lenses never intended for the task), I did succeed. It took many hours of tinkering with special lights, films, optics and tricks to get the first results.*

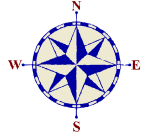
