- Top ticket seller above the 10 required ticket sales per family receives a \$30 iTunes gift card!

Expectations

- Attend the fundraiser March 15th, 2009
- Available one hour before and after seating
- Students are expected to be wait staff
- Wear black pants & shoes, white top (shirt)
- Each student is responsible for selling 10 meal tickets (adult \$12 child \$6)
- Each student brings 3 dozen dessert
- Each family will be responsible for visiting 6 community merchants with the hope of receiving a donation
- Each family will get a minimum of 3 donations (Community Merchant and/or home)
- Each student will donate 1 service item (babysitting, lawn work, mowing, raking, etc.)
- For every additional Silent Auction items received, above the 3 community/family and the 1 student, participant will receive a ½ credit.
- Parent hours – student get ½ credit for every hour a parent works (sign up form available)

We need to know everyone's availability for the day of the fundraiser so we can set the schedule

How to accumulate credit/hours:

- 1 credit for every hour worked
- ½ credit for every parent hour worked
- 1 credit for each dessert (everyone asked to bring in 3 desserts (3 doz.)
- 1 credit for the student service project
- 1 credit for every 1 adult or 2 child tickets sold
- 1 credit for each community merchant visit (everyone asked to visit 6 community merchants)
- 1 credit for every donation placed in the auction by family or community merchant visited
- **Bonus** 1 additional credit for auction items sold for \$75 or more

All credits/hours from every participant is added together and divided by the amount raised after all expenses to equal hourly wage. Wage is then multiplied for each participant's number of hours to get their grand total.

credits x wage = total money earned
